Dr. David Malkin will kickoff the day by delivering the George Donnell Society Lecture on Li-Fraumeni Syndrome at the Children's Hospital Los Angeles Pediatric Grand Rounds.

Pediatric sarcomas make up approximately 15 percent of all new childhood cancer diagnoses. Our 2014 Symposium will focus on the subset of pediatric soft tissue sarcomas, the most common of which is rhabdomyosarcoma. Leading scientists and clinicians from North America and Europe will discuss cutting-edge research in the field and set the tone for scientific progress and collaboration to understand the biology and improve the outcomes for pediatric soft tissue sarcoma over the next decade.

### The Issue

Each year, over 15,000 children and teens in the United States <u>alone</u> are diagnosed with a form of childhood cancer. Nearly 3,000 of those diagnoses are defined as a rare, aggressive cancer called a sarcoma:

Childhood cancer is the leading cause of death by disease in children & adolescents.

- ♥ Ewing's sarcoma (bone or soft tissue)
- ♥ Rhabdomyosarcoma (muscle)
- ♥ Osteosarcoma (bone)
- ♥ Desmoplastic Small Round Cell Tumor
- ♥ Rare sarcomas (tendon, nerve, or vascular)

Because sarcomas are more common in children and teens, the number of years of life lost to sarcomas is substantial, despite their relatively lower incidence rate when compared to adult cancers. The diversity of the disease only underscores the need for new discoveries. A lot can be learned about how other cancers behave from these solid tumors of the soft tissues.



Nearly two-thirds of childhood cancer survivors experience significant medical problems resulting from their original cancer treatment.

# The Experience


